Dear Parents and Carers,

At last the sunny weather has arrived! It has been so lovely to see the children enjoying our outside play areas. Classes have also been visiting Failand for sport and Forest School and making the most of this wonderful space in the summer months. We are looking forward to our Sports Days.

The teachers have once again used their skills to develop some after school clubs. This term children have been enjoying Hula Hoop Club, Code Club, Netball Club and Food Club. I joined Year 1 children for their Tyntesfield trip where I got to look around the walled garden and smell lots of different herbs with the children and also watched them make their own plant pots and plant seeds. 
We are now looking forward to the final term and can't quite believe how quickly this year has gone! We look forward to seeing you at our summer events. Many thanks as always for your continued support.
