## CST Trinity Academy

We are delighted to let you know that we now have a confirmed site for Cathedral Schools Trust's new secondary school. A brand new school, to be called CST Trinity Academy, will be built on land adjoining Stoke Park Primary School, located on Romney Avenue in North Bristol, subject to final approval by Bristol City Council in early March. The new school will help to meet the increased demand for secondary school places in Bristol and is planned to open for Year 7 students in September 2019, growing year on year with an eventual capacity of 1220 students (180 students per year group as well as sixth-form provision).

CST is looking forward to working closely with Bristol City Council, as well as primary and secondary school leaders, prospective families and community groups across Bristol, to deliver a new school for the north of the city.
